The Board of Park Commissioners at its meeting on June 11th, received an order dated May 21st, requesting provision be made for additional life guards at the various swimming places throughout the city.

The Board voted to inform you, pursuant to your request, that arrangements have been made to assign two E.R.A., workers, who qualify as life guards, to the task of assisting the regular department life guards at the beach at Gerry's Landing, this season.

On account of limited appropriation for attendants at the bath houses, in the annual budget of this year, no extra life guards than those regularly employed could be assigned.
