Mallahan, a former member of the Cambridge Police Department, entered the service of the Police Department on March 1, 1914 and on September 28, 1954 was retired under the provisions of Chapter 32, Section 83A, Clause a as a result of injuries sustained through no fault of his own in the performance of his duty, having served not less than forty years, and

WHEREAS:-

At the time of his retirement the aforesaid Charles H. Mallahan was unable to provide for any annual benefits to be paid to his widow at the time of his death which occurred on February 17, 1972, therefore be it

ORDERED:-

That under the provisions of Section 101 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, Tercentenary Edition and amendments thereto, there shall be paid to his widow, Susan Mallahan, for as long as she remains unmarried, an annual allowance in the amount of twelve hundred dollars (\$1200.00).

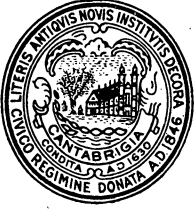

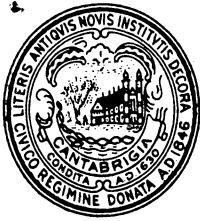


