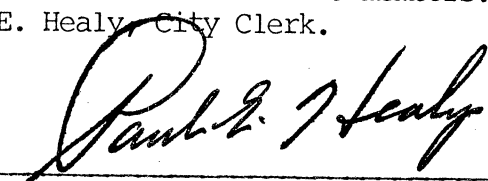
MAYOR RUSSELL

- WHEREAS: This City Council wishes to recognize and commend exemplary performance by members of the Cambridge Police Department; and
- WHEREAS: On the evening of October 31, 1984, Officer Robert Doherty was one of three Cambridge Patrol Officers who responded to a call concerning a woman lying unconscious at Magazine and Auburn Streets; and
- WHEREAS: The officers, upon arriving at the scene, found the woman with no pulse and not breathing and immediately administered cardio-pulmonary resuscitation; and
- WHEREAS: Officer Doherty and a civilian performed mouth-to-mouth resuscitation in an effort to revive the woman; and
- WHEREAS: Their efforts were successful in that the woman was revived and conveyed to the Cambridge Hospital for treatment of a heroin overdose; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council do hereby officially congratulate and commend Patrol Officer Robert Doherty for his life-saving efforts on the evening of October 31, 1984 and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a copy of this City Council resolution be made a part of his permanent record.
