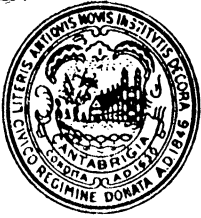

- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge faces a fiscal crisis due to the necessity of producing a budget for the coming fiscal year which must be some \$14 million less than the budget for the current fiscal year; and
- WHEREAS: Additional state aid or relief from the requirements of Proposition 2½ are essential if a large number of City employees are not to lose their jobs; and
- WHEREAS: Representative Charles Flaherty and Michael J. Lombardi have pledged to support in the Legislature efforts to assist Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The Boston Globe has reported that both of said Representatives voted against suspending the rules of the House to permit debate on legislation which would provide fiscal aid to the cities, and suspension failed to carry on a 75-75 vote; and
- WHEREAS: This defeat was reported by the newspapers as a significant defeat for cities and towns; now therefore be it
