An Ordinance

I further
In addition to an ordinance, to prevent
unlawful and injurious Practices, in
the Streets and other Public Places,
in the City: - Be it ordained, by the
City Council of the City of Cambridge,
as follows - No Person shall move
a cart or other vehicle, any horse, shop,
or other building through any street,
lane, or alley, or over any bridge, in the
City, without first obtaining a written
license therefor, from the mayor and
aldermen, or some person by them
authorized thereto, and on such terms
and conditions, as they shall deem
to be safe and proper.

The eleventh section of the ordi-
nance to which this ordinance is
in addition, is hereby repealed.
