WHEREAS: On Saturday, May 26, 1990, at approximately 11:30 in the evening, a Cambridge resident was intimidated and threatened with robbery as she tried to exit the Alewife MBTA Station by a large group of young people apparently returning from an Under-21 evening of entertainment at Faces on Route 2 (215 Concord Turnpike), Cambridge. A call for assistance by an MBTA employee to the MBTA Police went unanswered. With no response having been given by MBTA Police by 1:15 A.M. on May 27th, the intended victim walked home. For the record, let it be noted that no call was made to Cambridge police. Now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager apprise the General Manager of the MBTA of this incident, request an explanation for the non-response by MBTA Police and inquire what provisions MBTA policy has to monitor so large a number of young people at Alewife Station returning from the referenced establishment and heading out of Cambridge. Further, that the City Manager request the Police Chief of Cambridge to increase the monitoring of activities in the immediate vicinity of Faces at similar times when similar evenings of entertainment are scheduled; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to this Council on this matter no later than June 25, 1990 so that we Councillors are satisfied that policies are in place to prevent any repetition of this incident during the upcoming summer.
