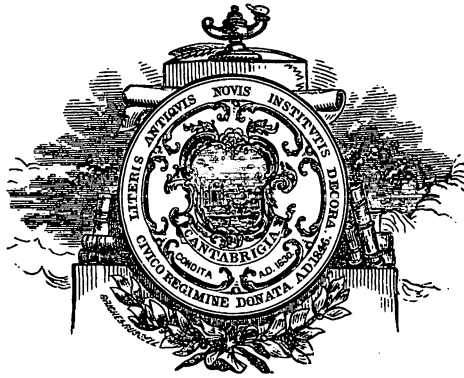


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Mayor and Aldermen,

Oct. 15. 1862.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that Brighton Street, in Ward No. One, between Brattle Square and Mount Auburn Street should be widened, so as to conform to the red lines shown on the Plan of said Street, in the City Clerk's Office, Street Plans, Vol. 2, Page 70, it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to William Reed, Martha P. Gregory, Susan Maria Porter, the Heirs of Joseph Porter, and any other person or persons whose land would be taken by such widening,

that this Board intends to widen the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as a public street—and that Friday, the twenty-fourth day of October current at 8 o'clock, A. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto, for which purpose the Board will be in session at the corner of Brattle & Brighton Streets.
