Ca holic High S uden s Selec ed For Na ionl Honors

BOSTON — Cardinal Bernard Law praised two local Catholic high school students selected for national honors during a special reception at his Brighton residence June 5.

Keri Louise Gibson of Notre Dame Academy in Hingham, and Michael S. Fitzpatrick of Don Bosco Technical High School in Boston, were chosen from a wide field of Boston candidates to attend the Salute to Excellence Weekend in New York City later this month.

The weekend, now in its 30th year, is sponsored by the American Academy of Achievement and brings together about 50 men and women who are leaders in a wide variety of fields. Four hundred high school honor students are also invited.

"I'm impressed," the cardinal said. "I think that they reflect beautifully on the value of Catholic education. I'm very encouraged by both of them, and I know that their schools and their families are proud of them."

Sister Jeanne d'Arc O'Hare, CSJ, secretary of education for the Archdiocese and a member of the selection committee, said the students were chosen for their varied accomplishments in academics, athletics, community service, leader-

ship, test scores and extracurricular interests.

"You have to be excellent, and they fit that criteria," she said. "They have very high academic averages and they're leaders in their schools."

During the weekend, the students will stay at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel and enjoy a dinner cruise, trips to the United Nations building and the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and a black tie banquet. Some of those expected to be in

attendance are Barbara Walters, Audrey Hepburn and Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf.

Gibson, a Hanover resident, was president of her school's chapter of the National Honor Society, and a

Cardinal Bernard Law has accepted the decision of Rev. John L. Mansfield not to seek reappointment as Pastor of St. Ann Parish, West Bridgewater. After participating in the priestly renewal program, Father Mansfield will accept another archdiocesan appointment. Cardinal Law has appointed Very Rev. William F. Waters, OSA, to serve as Vicar for the Lawrence Vicariate in the Merrimack Region, effective June 30, 1991. Father Waters will assume this responsibility for the next several months, replacing Very Rev. Emile R. Guilmette, SM, who is being reassigned.

National Merit Commended Student. She was also a member of the French Honor Society and captain of the volleyball team.

Fitzpatrick, who lives in Cambridge, was class valedictorian, a National Merit Scholar and vice president of his school's National Honor Society chapter. He swam and played water polo for four years, and volunteered at a shelter for the homeless.

Both students say they plan to attend the University of Pennsylvania in the fall. Gibson will study international relations, and Fitzpatrick plans to study mathematics with an eye toward becoming a high school teacher.

The cardinal also praised Edward L. Hennessy of New Jersey, a former Bostonian and trustee of Pope John XXIII Seminary, who was instrumental in having local Catholic high schools recognized by

the American Academy of Achievement.

Hennessy, chairman of the board of Allied Signal, Inc., is himself to be honored at the upcoming weekend, and the two students will be his guests.

"I am very grateful that his own interests make possible this opportunity to graduates of the Archdiocese each year," Cardinal Law said. "And I would like to go myself. It sounds like it's going to be a lot of fun."

Medeiros Scholarships

The fifth annual awarding of Medeiros Scholarships will take place on Monday, June 24 [coverage will follow in the June 28 *Pilot*]. Thirteen seniors from archdiocesan high schools will receive full, four-year scholarships to Boston University. The scholarships are named in memory of the late Cardinal Humberto Medeiros.
