Marylou Sudders: Commissioner of the Massachusetts Mental Health Department with a national reputation for her expertise in the field of mental health, her legislative achievements in the field and her strong and passionate advocacy for individuals with mental illness.

Jacqueline Goodrum Tynes: former Associate Director of Cambridge College, award-winning participant in community affairs, including 54 years of dedicated service as a Missionary of the St. Paul African Methodist Episcopal Church and invaluable work as an active member of the Cambridge African American Heritage Trail.

Gertrude (Trudy) Bartlet: this year's winner of the Ruth L Barron Award for Service and Commitment to the YWCA. Residential Counselor in the YWCA Family Shelter known for gentle and caring manner with children in the shelter and her creativeness and practicality.

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to each award winner on behalf of the entire City Council.

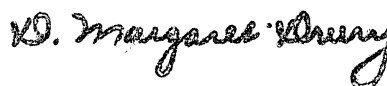
