September 14, 1981

WHEREAS:

October 23, 1981 marks the 25th Anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution, an attempt by freedom fighters to establish a coalition government, to end Soviet economic domination in Hungary, and to free the Hungarian people from the oppression of the Soviet police state; and

WHEREAS:

Despite the valiant efforts of the many thousands of freedom fighters who died in the Revolution and of those who were jailed or deported when Soviet forces overran Hungary again, not one of the goals of human freedom for which they fought in 1956 has been realized; and

WHEREAS:

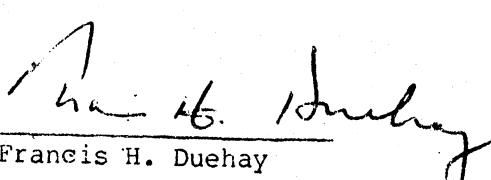
The people of Hungary look to the United States as a citadel of human freedom and to the people of the United States as leaders in bringing about their freedom and independence; and

WHEREAS:

We the people of Cambridge should, on this anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution, reaffirm our devotion to the ideals of freedom and government by consent, and by so doing issue a beacon of hope to the oppressed people of Hungary; therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That I, Francis H. Duehay, Mayor of Cambridge, Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim Friday, October 23, 1981 "Hungarian Freedom Fighters' Day" and urge that all our citizens pay special tribute to these brave people by studying the plight of Hungary and by committing ourselves to the just aspirations of the Hungarians.

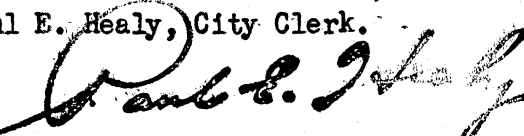
