

To the Honorable, the Mayor and Aldermen,

The undersigned respectfully pray that a proper stone crossing
for foot passengers be placed across Harvard Street at
some point between Dunster & Holyoke St.

They would respectfully submit that the present
crossings at Holyoke and Dunster St. do not
sufficiently accommodate the public. Persons
coming from the vicinity of North Ave. to the stores
in Little's Block & Holyoke House are unwilling to
cross at Dunster St. from the great width of the
street, the general bad condition, and the great width
of the gutter. The next point of crossing would
be Holyoke St. and this is considerably beyond their
point of destination. They would respectfully
represent that a large proportion of the retail trade
of Harvard St. is transacted in the locality alluded to.
