Since no one had inspected the inside I requested that whoever reassessed it come and go thru from cellar to attic. She said she would have that done but no one came. This was October 7, 1983.

When paying the taxes May 20, 1984 I wrote a protesting letter with the above information, sending a copy to Thomas Danahy. You can imagine my dismay over

when the bill just received was
uped to \$144,900.00.

Since I am 85 years old,
incapacitated because of two broken
hips, unable to protest verbally, feel
it is a reasonable request to again
ask for a knowledge person inspect
the inside of the house. I am sure
no way would a buyer pay that
price.
