Thomas Spillane, 45

Was Boston Globe pressman

Thomas M. Spillane, a Boston Globe employee for 29 years, died Sunday in South Shore Hospital. He was 45 and lived in Marshfield.

Born in Limerick City, Ireland, Mr. Spillane was a pressman at The Boston Globe. He moved to the United States as a young boy.

Mr. Spillane, a member of the International Pressman's Union, had lived in Revere before moving to Marshfield 16 years ago.

He leaves his wife, Doris (Fitzpatrick); two daughters, Doris Marie and Trisha Ann, both of Marshfield; and three sisters, Noel Spillane and Rita McCarthy, both of Revere, and Patricia Claffey of Ireland.

A funeral Mass will be said Thursday morning at 10 a.m. in St. Christine's Church. Burial will be in Couch Cemetery, Marshfield.

Lewis Armistead, 71

Harvard University official

Lewis A. Armistead of Cambridge, a Harvard University official, died Friday of cancer. He was 71.

Mr. Armistead, a great-great-grandson of Daniel Webster, worked in Harvard's Office of Government and Community Affairs from 1972 until his death.

Born in Boston, Mr. Armistead graduated from the Portsmouth Priory School. Upon graduation he worked at the State Street Bank & Trust Co. for 20 years.

During World War II he served in the US Army Air Corps as a first lieutenant. He was a prisoner of war for eight months in Romania after being shot down over Ploesti.

He leaves his wife, Barbara (Jones); three sons, Lewis A. Jr., David A., and Daniel W., all of Cambridge; and two daughters, Mary A. and Barbara L. also of Cambridge.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. tomorrow in Saint Paul's Church, Cambridge. Burial will be in Mount Auburn Cemetery.
