WHEREAS: The City's nonprofit CASCAP, on July 26, 1999, purchased the 8 Bigelow Street property with funding from the Cambridge Affordable Housing Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS: The above purchase represent the culmination of a year-long community effort to respond to the immediate and long term housing needs of the remaining two tenants, Francesco Caserta and Paul Shea, and to preserve the property as permanently affordable SRO housing; and

WHEREAS: The tenants of 8 Bigelow Street, the Campaign to Save 2000 Homes, and the Cambridge Eviction Free Zone express deep appreciation to the Cambridge City Council for their help and support for the 8 Bigelow Street tenants and their goals; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That during the repairs and renovations of 8 Bigelow Street everything possible be done so that the current tenants be able to stay in their building; and be it further

ORDERED: That if temporary relocation becomes necessary, then the tenants be adequately accommodated in another CASCAP owned or leased property in Cambridge and be able to move back into their building after renovations; and be it further

ORDERED: That a copy of this resolution be sent to Bradley Day of CASCAP on the behalf of the entire Cambridge City Council.
