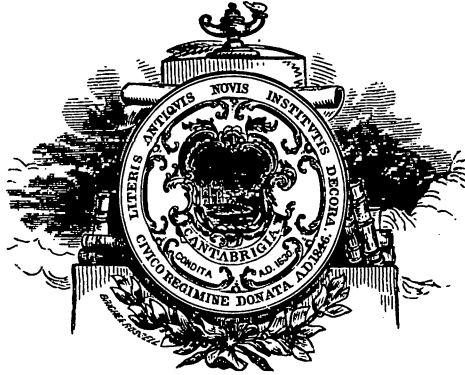

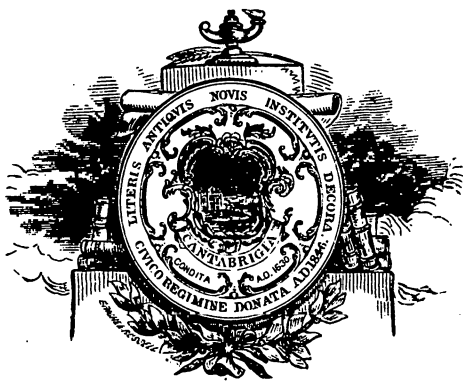

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *Fresh Pond Avenue*, so called, extending from the junction of *Lake View Avenue* and *Vassall Lane* to *Concord Avenue*,

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *100 feet and upwards*, in width between *the aforesaid junction of Lake View Avenue and Vassall Lane*, - and *Concord Avenue*,

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *the City Engineer* and dated *May 19th 1879*.

The Committee on Roads and Bridges,

to which was referred the ~~petition~~ matter of the proposed laying out of Fresh Pond Avenue, so-called, from the junction of Lake View Avenue and Cassall Lane to Concord Avenue,

Reports,

~~Recommending~~ That this matter was originally before the Board of Aldermen, in the year 1886, an order of notice having been adopted in reference to the same, Oct. 14, said order being returnable Oct. 27 1886, at which date the hearing was continued to Nov. 3rd and then again postponed to Nov 10, 1886, at which time the subject was referred to the Committee on Claims, with instructions to give a hearing ^{therein} to Mr. S. M. Bofran. The hearing was duly given, and the Committee reported that Mr. Bofran objected to the proposed laying out of the avenue aforesaid. The report of the Committee on Claims was made Dec. 22nd 1886, and thereafter referred to the Committee on Roads and Bridges with instructions to report an order for laying out the avenue in accordance with the order of notice as originally issued.
