Re: Eight (8) bird feeders are located at 65 Belmont Street, Cambridge owned by Charles and Diane Chute

In regard to the eight bird feeders, there are problems occurring as the result.

8-10 Norman Street, Cambridge is owned by Mildred Abcunas, is sustaining roof damage by the pigeons. Mrs. Abcunas has lived there for forty years. The pigeons, along with some other birds, sit on the roof either before or after they eat from the bird feeders.

Teddy Riley of 9-11 Norumbega Street, Cambridge, is also sustaining damage to his roof. He also found a dead pigeon in his backyard on Sunday, May 6, 2001.

The bird feeders are located primarily in the driveway, which is next to Mrs. Abcunas' property and perpendicular to Mr. Riley's.

The Chutes, who are constantly feeding the birds, have the peaks of their house blocked with screens, with one containing a bed of nails in it. The bird feeders are also attracting squirrels.

Please look into this matter, as the birds are destroying our properties and cars.


