WHEREAS: Numerous people in the North Cambridge area who travel by MBTA, cross Massachusetts Avenue at Dudley Street to get to the North Cambridge Car Barn; and

WHEREAS: Cars travelling Mass Avenue speed by, ignoring pedestrians trying to cross the street; and

WHEREAS: The "Stop for Pedestrians in Crosswalks" sign at the corner of Dudley Street, is small, and too high for motorists to even notice; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is directed to confer with the Director of Traffic and Parking to install larger, more visible signs, or to put signs on the divider in the middle of Massachusetts Avenue to indicate the fact that State Law requires motorists to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalks; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Director of Traffic and Parking look into the possibility of installing these signs on the road divider in all intersections where there is a crosswalk on Mass Avenue from Harvard Square to Alewife Brook Parkway, and report back to the City Council.
