RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitable engrossed copy of this resolution to Alice on behalf of the entire City Council.

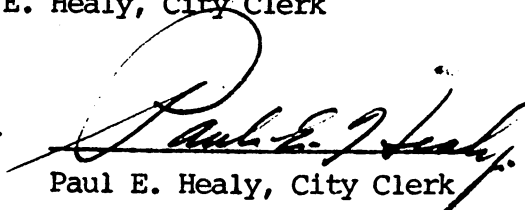
