Dear Mr. Healy:

As an executive committee member of the Rindge Towers Tenants Union I request that we be placed on the Agenda at the forthcoming City Council Meeting, Monday February 7, 1972.

We would like to discuss the serious physical danger we have been placed in by our landlord, Mr. Max Wasserman, as a result of his construction of a new apartment building next to the two already existing structures in which we live. For the second time in ten days loose structures atop the building under construction have fallen from the building and have landed in and around the building at 364 Rindge, causing extensive damage to tenants' property and numerous bodily injuries. The perilous nature of the situation makes it imperative that we inform City Council as soon as possible.

In addition, we feel it our duty to inform the Council of various management practices at Rindge Towers which seem to us to run contrary to the purposes of low-to-moderate income housing, for which much Federal money and many civic privileges have been granted to Mr. Wasserman.
