Grace Kaczynski, 77, Cambridge psychologist

Grace (McGlinchey) Kaczynski of Cambridge, a child psychologist, died Wednesday at University Hospital in Boston. She was 77.

Born in Charlestown, she was a resident of Cambridge for more than 60 years.

Mrs. Kaczynski was valedictorian of Cambridge High and Latin in 1930 and graduated from Radcliffe College in 1934. She later received a master's and doctorate in education from Harvard.

During the 1960s, she served as an associate professor at Tufts University for eight years, and at Northeastern for three years. She taught educational statistics and the measurement of intelligence.

Mrs. Kaczynski was director of student services for the Cambridge public schools for three years and before retiring served as director of pupil services for the Watertown public schools for five years.

For many years, Mrs. Kaczynski served as president of

the Massachusetts School Psychologists Association, which she helped organize.

She was a member of a committee appointed by the governor that led to legislation for certification of school psychologists. She also served on the state committee that established and set standards for teachers of the emotionally disturbed and the training of disabled and handicapped specialists.

She is survived by three daughters, Michelle of Scituate, Janice of Roslindale and Grace Sandell of Marshfield; a son, James of Gloucester; a sister, Genevieve Mathison of Newport, R.I.; and five grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated for Mrs. Kaczynski at 10 a.m. Monday at St. Paul's Church, 29 Mount Auburn St., Cambridge.

Burial will be in Holy Cross Cemetery, Malden.
