

In the Year one thousand eight hundred and fifty three.

An Ordinance

^{for further} In execution to an ordinance for the removal of Nuisances, Sources of Filth, and Causes of Sickness, within the City of Cambridge.

1st Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:— 1 No person shall put or leave any dead animal substance, fish offal, contents of any vault, decayed vegetable or other matter, in any public street or place, or near any inhabited dwelling, whereby any offensive or noxious stench or effluvia shall be created, and the health or comforts of the citizens be injuriously affected; and no person shall throw any dead animal, or the contents of any vault, into the river adjoining the City.

2. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this ordinance

or the ordinance to which this is in
accident, shall forfeit and pay a sum, not
less than one dollar, nor more than twenty
dollars.

3. The seventh and ninth sections of an
ordinance relating to the removal of
nuisances, sources of filth and causes of
sickness, passed on the twenty eighth day
of July, eighteen hundred and forty six, be,
and the same are hereby repealed.
