WHEREAS: Residents of the City of Cambridge are suffering as a result of the current national recession with Cambridge experiencing an average unemployment rate of 6% for 1992; and

WHEREAS: A survey conducted for the Cambridge Department of Human services and presented to the City Council on March 30th of this year shows that one fourth of all Cambridge households have experienced unemployment by a household member in the past year; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge Employment Plan calls upon the City Manager to designate a Massachusetts nonprofit corporation as the City's Employment and Training Agency and Employment Resources, Inc. has been so designed; and

WHEREAS: Article II of the Cambridge Employment Plan states that on "any construction project which is funded in whole or in part by City, State or Federal funds....,"

- "1) No less than 25% of the total employee worker hours shall be performed by bona fide Cambridge residents.
- 2) No less than 25% of the total employee worker hours shall be performed by minority persons.
- 3) No less than 10% of the total employee worker hours shall be performed by women."; and

WHEREAS: On September 30, 1991 the City Council requested that the City Manager report on the feasibility of establishing a Residents Jobs Policy similar to that of Boston; and

WHEREAS: On November 21, 1991 the City Manager responded by promising a full report on this subject within one month; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That His Honor the Mayor be and hereby is requested to schedule a public hearing with regard to the implementation of the Cambridge Employment Plan; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager shall provide the City Council with a list of all publicly assisted construction projects currently under construction or planned for construction this year; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager shall invite the appropriate representatives from Employment Resources, Inc., and other appropriate City Agencies to report on their efforts to implement the provisions of the Cambridge Employment Plan, particularly Article II.
