In response to the City Council's request that the Gateway Cities Advisory Committee reconsider its recommendations to the City Manager on Gateway Cities allocations, we respectfully defer any further changes in our recommendations to you. We have attached copies of all proposals received by the Committee for the Councillors' review as requested. The committee's decision is based on the following:

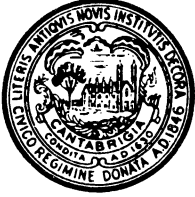
1. The Committee was chosen to represent a broad range of immigrant groups as well as to utilize their years of experience and expertise serving on the Commission or within their community. Their recommendations to the City Manager were based on an accumulated knowledge of Cambridge's human service issues, needs, and grant-making procedures.
2. The process for developing the criteria and guidelines for proposals and the proposal review procedures were both responsible and comprehensive. No public testimony or comments were received which challenged the validity of the process.
3. The final array of services recommended for funding reflected a balance among the three service categories specified in the RFP and prioritized in the testimony of individuals at the public hearing on March 4. These categories included health, education and social service programs. The breakdown by provider type demonstrated, in the opinion of the Committee, an equitable distribution (35% to non-profit community based agencies, 7% to the Community Learning Center in collaboration with two community based agencies, 20% to the Cambridge School Department and 38% to Cambridge Hospital). In addition, allocations to specific service providers were made to those providers who could most appropriately carryout services in those high priority areas designated by the community.

For the above stated reasons the Committee re-submits to the City Manager the original recommendations for the allocation of Gateways Cities funds.

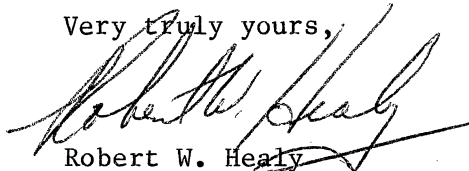
