RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Champion family on behalf of the entire City Council.

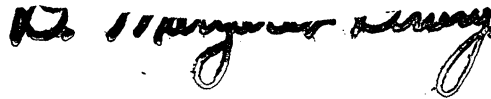

WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Hale Champion on April 23, 2008; and

WHEREAS: Hale Champion had a distinguished career during which he served the public good in many venues; and

WHEREAS: Hale Champion held leadership positions in government, politics, higher education, foundations and policy advocacy; he served as Undersecretary of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Director of Finance for the state of California, Chief of Staff to Governor Edmund "Pat" Brown, Chief of Staff to Massachusetts Governor Michael S. Dukakis, Director of the Boston Redevelopment Authority, and chairman and member of more than a dozen federal and state governmental boards and commissions; and

WHEREAS: Hale served twice as financial vice president at major universities; first the University of Minnesota and later at Harvard University; he was the first executive dean of Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government; and

WHEREAS: Hale was a longtime member and chairman of the board for the Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation and led its reorganization and change of mission during the 1990's; and

WHEREAS: In an earlier career, Hale was a successful journalist who wrote for several prominent newspapers, including the San Francisco Chronicle, and a number of national magazines; he was chosen as a Nieman Fellow by Harvard University; and

WHEREAS: Hale's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Marie Ozone Tiff; his children Thomas Champion and his wife Robyn and his daughter Katherine Champion Murphy and her husband Brian; and his grandchildren Sarah Champion and Molly and Joseph Murphy; and

WHEREAS: Hale will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it
