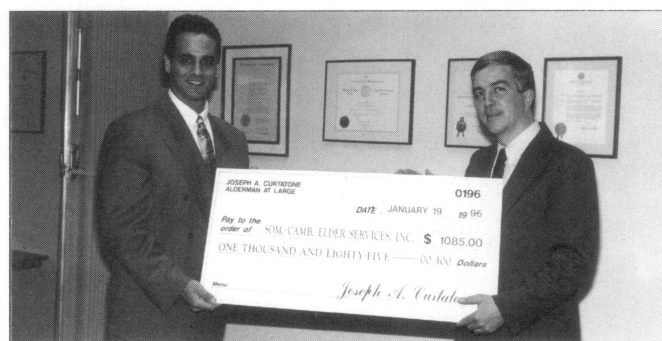
1996 SILVER DOVE AWARDEES

Whether the message is in Creole, Portuguese, or English, the facts are the same! Healthy eating, along with exercise, can delay or even reverse the aging process. That is the main concept presented to 30 Haitian and Portuguese elders as part of the *Healthy Living Wellness Program*.

This May, Jean Bianchetto, R.D., Nutrition and Health Educator for Somerville-Cambridge Elder Services, conducted a training program for representatives from the Somerville YWCA, Harvard Community Health Plan, Haitian Elders Program, and congregate meal sites. Supplied with a lending library and a video featuring a physical therapist and registered dietitian, group facilitators in Cambridge and Somerville will be helping elders take an active role in their own health and well being.
