WHEREAS: Many trucks are currently observed driving on Memorial Drive in violation of the existing prohibition against trucks on this roadway; and

WHEREAS: The MDC and the State Police do not appear to be enforcing the restrictions against trucks on Memorial Drive; and

WGEREAS: This apparent failure to enforce the current restrictions has frustrated the many Cambridge residents who have unsuccessfully urged the MDC to lift its restriction on trucks to allow those trucks exiting a future Stop and Shop "Superstore" to drive a short distance over Memorial Drive; and

WHEREAS: Those residents feel that if the current restrictions were enforced AND the exemption made for the approximately 130 trucks which will exit the store every week, the result would be no net gain of trucks; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council urge the MDC, the State Police, and other responsible authorities to embark at once on a program of concentrated enforcement to eliminate illegal commercial vehicles from Memorial Drive, and further urge Governor Weld and Cambridge legislators to encourage and assist the MDC and the police in this effort with such additional legislation and/or funding as may be necessary to carry out this effort.
