WHEREAS:

The Cambridge City Council recognizes the funding inadequacies facing the Cambridge Model Cities Program and its operating agencies; and

WHEREAS:

The Model Cities Program, both locally and nationally, has without doubt been one of the most viable and successful programs to in fact develop and implement programs to improve the quality of life for urban residents; and

WHEREAS:

The Model Cities Program has demonstrated the success of shared partnership program planning and program implementation between government and residents; therefore be it

RESOLVED:

The Cambridge City Council and Cambridge Model Cities Program are jointly requesting that the Administration and Congress provide for the following:

1. That funding for Cambridge, and those cities having funded Model Cities Programs, be restored to the full supplementary grant amount established prior to January 1, 1973; and
2. That the necessary action and support be given to provide sufficient funds to restore and to maintain the level of funding for Model Cities until such time as presently proposed superseding legislation is enacted and the program implemented to make legislative action operational; and
3. That the President and Secretary of Housing and Urban Development release the \$75 million in currently impounded monies; and
4. That the Model Cities process and citizen participation developed in Model Cities be continued in future legislation and programs; and
5. That copies of this resolution be forwarded to all appropriate local, state and federal government agencies, persons and departments.
