At a general meeting of the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Association, on November 22, 1975 the following official position was taken:

"We the members of the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Association agree in general principle and support the present high school plan, with the following provisions:

- (1) A satisfactory budget be established for park development and lot replacement, and that the neighborhood be involved in its planning;
- (2) That a reasonable program of joint control of the "relocation park" be established by the City Council and the School Committee.

The High School Committee of Mid-Cambridge has been working endless hours to insure a quality park-replacement in the interest of the immediate neighborhood and the entire Cambridge community. We would like to take the position that if this structural concern of the "over hang" will in any way delay or defeat the building of the new high school as approved by the School Building Assistance Bureau and thus jeopardize the 65% State reimbursement funding. We are against it.

Thank you for your concern in this matter of utmost importance to us.
