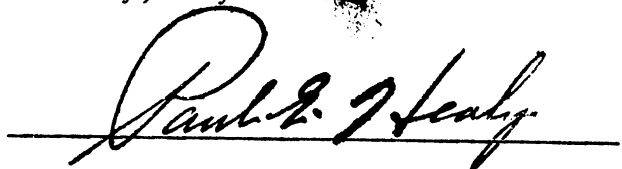

- WHEREAS: Charles, who served on the Berklee College faculty for twelve years, was a graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music and the Boston Conservatory of Music and spent his entire adult life in and around the musical profession; and
- WHEREAS: Charles was also extremely active in civic, fraternal and religious organizations, serving as a 33rd Degree Mason; past Master of Celestial Lodge 2, Royal Arch Masons and among many other organizations and positions, served as Deputy Imperial Director of Talent and Scholarship of the Ancient Egyptian Arabic Order, Nobles of Mystic Shrine and was the Grand Organist for both the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Masons and Grand Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star of Massachusetts; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Vera Cox and to the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
