- WHEREAS: This City Council recently learned of the departure of City Engineer Joan Lastovica, a 1969 graduate of the New Jersey Institute of Technology, after completing seven years of service, effective February 6th, 1989; and
- WHEREAS: Throughout her tenure, Ms. Lastovica has strived to initiate, implement and maintain professional and organizational standards for the office of City Engineer, working to reorganize the office to meet the growing demands of an urban city; assessing and planning the alleviation of impact on city services through increased private development; and
- WHEREAS: Ms. Lastovica worked to establish construction standards and reviewed designs of both public and private projects throughout the city, as well as having provided in-house design and construction services to many municipal departments; and
- WHEREAS: During her tenure, she specifically oversaw the completion of over \$12 million in street and sidewalk projects, developed a publication of de-watering regulations for deep foundation buildings and provided design review and construction coordination of the MBTA Red Line subway extension; and
- WHEREAS: Ms. Lastovica will leave the employment of the City to accept a job as Vice-President and General Manager of BSC Transportation, Inc., a new wholly-owned subsidiary, building upon her previous experience from Fay Spofford Thorndike and Anderson Nichols; two private-sector consulting firms; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our deep appreciation for the dedication and professionalism shown by Joan Lastovica and to further extend every good wish for success in her new career; and be it further
