Gentlemen-

The Board at its meeting on the 4th of October received three orders under date of September 13th; one relative to reopening with supervision certain playgrounds, a second relative to improving condition of road, from Clifton Street into Russell Field; a third as to the advisability of trimming all shade trees which interfere with lighting of streets.

In reply to the first order, the Board states that supervision on a part time basis, by three remaining employees of the Recreation division of the department, is being given now on the playgrounds mentioned; to the second order a report that this matter was to be taken care of by the Superintendent of Streets, as understood at a conference with His Honor, on the budget figures for 1932; to the third order the Board would ask that further time be allowed for consideration of the matter contained therein.
