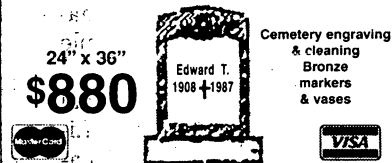
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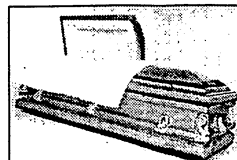
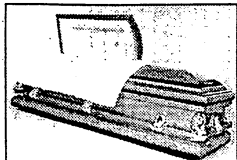

Deborah Anderson, 41

Worked for Joseph P. Kennedy II

Deborah R. Anderson, an original member of former congressman Joseph P. Kennedy II's staff, died of breast cancer Monday in New England Medical Center. She was 41.

A lifelong resident of Roxbury, she attended the Boston public schools before graduating from Shaw preparatory school.

She attended Boston College, where she joined the Young Democrats club and majored in political science. She received her bachelor's degree in 1980.

She worked as a passenger service agent for Air Canada and telecommunications coordinator for Masco in the Longwood medical area. Her activity in Democratic politics brought her to join Kennedy's staff after his election in 1986. She worked in his Boston office as a district representative.

She helped immigrants obtain US citizenship, travel documents, and work permits and was known for her ability to negotiate the maze of immigration bureaucracy to reunite family members separated by international borders.

Robert Nolan, 78

Retired Boston fire lieutenant

Robert Nolan of Dedham, a retired lieutenant for the Boston Fire Department, died Friday at Faulkner Hospital in Jamaica Plain. He was 78.

Mr. Nolan was born in Boston and educated in Boston schools.

He served in the Navy during World War II as an aviation machinist 1st class aboard the USS Shangri-La. He received a commendation.

Mr. Nolan worked as a salesman until he became a firefighter with Ladder 16 in Roslindale in 1948. He transferred to Engine 43 in South Boston in 1955, was promoted to lieutenant, and went to Engine 39 in South Boston in 1968. He transferred to West Roxbury Engine 55 in 1977, where he remained until his retirement in 1984.

He moved from West Roxbury to Dedham in 1969.

Mr. Nolan was a member of the Firefighters Local Union No. 718, the Boston Firemen's Relief Fund, the Boston Firemen's Mutual Relief fund, and the Society of St. Florian.

He leaves a daughter, Susan M. Bannon of West Roxbury; two sons, Robert G. of Fort Myers, Fla., and Mark F. of Dedham; a brother, Richard, of West Roxbury; two sisters, Nancy Nolan of Wareham and Betty Slatkiewicz of Taunton; and five grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said in St. Mary's Church in Dedham at 11 a.m. Monday. Burial will be in the Massachusetts National Cemetery in Bourne.

Though neither Mrs. Loeb nor her paper ever abandoned her conservative principles, she is credited with making the Union Leader more refined and professional newspaper during her years as publisher.

"I definitely thought her effect on the paper was to moderate harshness," said Michael Pride, editor of the Concord Monitor. "While the paper retained its really strong views, it did so in a less bombastic way under her leadership."

The Union Leader's influence has diminished somewhat in recent years, with the rise of Manchester television station, WMUR-TV. But remained the state's biggest newspaper, with a circulation of about 63,000 on weekdays and 85,000 Sunday, and continued to play a role as kingmaker in Republican Party politics.

In 1996, Mrs. Loeb's endorsement of Pat Buchanan helped him claim an upset victory in the state's storied presidential primary over Senator Bob Dole. Buchanan called her his political "godmother." She was a longstanding irritant to the presidential campaigns of former President George Bush.

"We certainly don't want someone who is either so stupid or so dishonest as president of the United States," Mrs. Loeb wrote, when Bush was still vice president.

Texas Governor George W. Bush said yesterday that while he and Mrs. Loeb "did not always agree her opinions and influence always helped shape the politics and the independent spirit of the state of New Hampshire."

Once the Union Leader settled on a candidate, it trumpeted the person's virtues in comprehensive coverage, editorial cartoons, and trademark front-page signed editorials.
