Mr. Nolan was born in Boston. He attended Northeastern University.

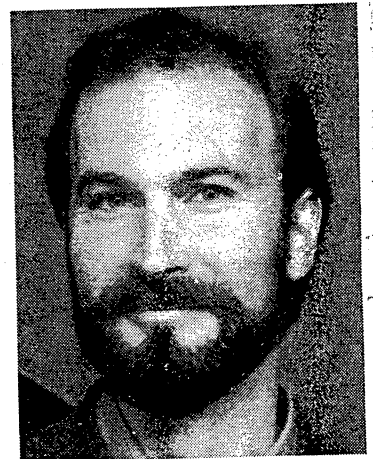
While serving in the Army during World War II, he was stationed at Pearl Harbor during the Japanese surprise attack. He also served on Guadalcanal.

Anthony Winfisky, museum curator

Anthony Winfisky Jr. of Salem, a curator at Peabody Essex Museum, died April 9 in Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston. He was 52.

Born in Boston and raised in Danvers, Mr. Winfisky was known as Paul.

After attending Massachusetts College of Art, he was employed by Peabody Essex Museum in Salem for 27 years. He was associate curator of maritime history, keeper of pictures, and curator of the Chinnery Collection.

ORDER ADOPTED
