The Joint Committee on Public Property, who were instructed by an order of March 9th to erect a City Stable on Hampshire Street, together with all necessary trimments, Sheds, and fences, at an expense not to exceed \$1500, ask leave to

Report

The Committee in the performance of their duty contracted with Mr. Simon P. Clark to build the Stable, Shed and Fence— The contractor has completed his work with great faithfulness and to the satisfaction of the Committee, at an expense for this purpose of \$1390.62, comprising \$1045.00 as the contract price for the Stable and Shed, \$293.37 for building 889 feet of Fence at 33 cents per foot, and \$22.21 for extra work.

The Committee have also approved a bill of \$15.00 for a Plan drawn by Mr. Stevens, a bill of \$28.00 for painting done by Geo. W. Stacy, bill of \$38.00 from Mr. Walworth for introducing water pipes &c., and a bill of \$2.00 for iron work from Mr. Finnegan—

The Bills approved make the cost of the Stable and appurtenances amount to \$1472.08
