IN CITY COUNCIL

June 30, 1986

WHEREAS:

Neighborhood residents and others are experiencing difficulty gaining access to Sennott Park by car because early morning commuters use the parking spaces along Broadway for the entire work day; and

WHEREAS:

Such a preemptive use of parking spaces renders it both hazardous and inconvenient if not impossible for parents to make safe drop-offs of children to the tot lot, and for others attempting to make use of the park for various recreational purposes; therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the City Manager be requested to order the Director of Traffic and Parking to immediately erect four signs on the Sennott Park side of Broadway between Prospect and Norfolk Streets declaring it a tow area with no parking permitted from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and imposing a two hour parking limit after that time with parking for residents only.
