COUNCILLOR RUSSELL

- WHEREAS: Many landlords throughout the City are extremely hard-pressed to make repairs to their property due to the constraints placed upon them by strict rent control laws; and
- WHEREAS: There are already in place throughout the City several agencies and/or programs which provide funding or information relative to funding of housing rehabilitation programs, such as the Cambridge Neighborhood Apartment Housing Service, the Moderate Rehabilitation Program of the Housing Authority, the Community Development Department Just-A-Start, the Neighborhood Stabilization Committees in North Cambridge and East Cambridge, as well as the Historical Commission; and
- WHEREAS: Many landlords are unaware of the accessibility of these programs, as well as the information relating to them; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to initiate a publicity campaign in an effort to inform the residents and property owners throughout the City of the opportunities which exist for the rehabilitation of their homes; said publicity should include appropriate advertisements in local newspapers; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to submit a report to the Council relative to the action taken by him pursuant to this order.
