- WHEREAS: Thousands of our local citizens have learned to tap their local emergency service systems and are continuing to learn techniques of First Aid and Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation so that they may help their fellow human beings in time of need; and
- WHEREAS: The Office of Emergency Medical Services of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Public Health in cooperation with the American College of Emergency Physicians is sponsoring the tenth annual Emergency Medical Services Week as a time to recognize the importance of this service; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the members of the Cambridge City Council declare the week of September 21 through 27, 1986 as EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WEEK; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Acting City Clerk prepare a duly engrossed copy of this Resolution and forward same to Roy Kniveton, Assistant Director, Office of Emergency Services, Department of Public Health, 80 Boylston Street, Suite 1040, Boston, MA. 02116.
