Dear Mr. Sullivan:

Since the L.E.E.A. grant award documents for police training and police/community task forces forwarded to your office yesterday do not fully reflect the financial status of the awards, please be advised of the following:

1. Both grants are continuations of existing grants.
2. The page of the grant award documents entitled "Cash Matching Certificate" indicates the specific amount of the federal grant and the minimum amount required for the city match [5.555% of the federal grant]. However, the amount of the State buy-in is not specified but is indicated as also being 5.555% of the federal grant. Specifically, the State buy-in for each of the grants is:

Police Training	\$1,550.00
Task Force	1,389.00

Program Goal Statement:

Provide new recruits with a minimum of 12 weeks of training as well as emergency cardio-pulmonary resuscitation in-service training for other department personnel as required by Chap. 111 Sec. 201 of the Mass. General Laws.



Program Goal Statement:

Provide administrative and multi-lingual personnel to establish and maintain police-community cooperation and communication through monthly meetings with ten neighborhood task forces throughout the city and coordinate joint police/community activities.

4. The police department budget FY '76 includes an appropriation of \$15,000 which may be used as the city match for L.E.E.A. funds. The city match of \$9,978 for the task force project represents the unexpended balance of the \$15,000 appropriation. Since the continuation grant application request for \$50,000 in federal funds was reduced to \$25,000, the city match of \$9,978 [an amount substantially greater than that required] was budgeted for the grant in order to insure the continuation of the program at the reduced level of funding.

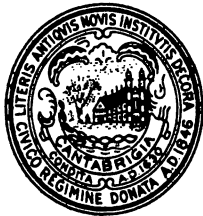

To the Honorable, the City Council:

Enclosed herewith you will find two letters from Robert J. Kane, Executive Director of the Committee on Criminal Justice, informing the City of grants to the Police Department from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration. The grant monies are to be used for the Police Recruit and Inservice Training program (\$27,900) and the Police/Community Task Force program (\$25,000).
