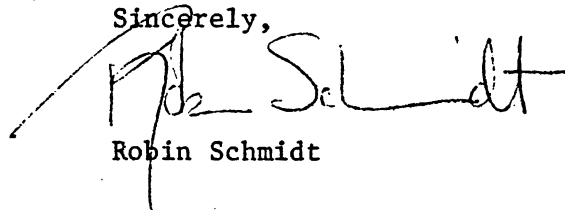
Dear Mr. Parris:

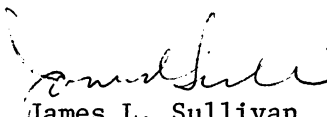
