March 24, 1986

- WHEREAS: Satisfactory arrangements for the opening of the rear door of the Purity Supreme Market in Central Square for access by the senior citizens of Manning Apartments have reached a stalemate; and
- WHEREAS: The Central Square Business Association has been unable to move Purity Supreme for a satisfactory solution to the problem; and
- WHEREAS: The possibility of the loss of business of the 230 residents of Manning Apartments might move the Purity Supreme to make suitable arrangements for them; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager instruct the Department of Human Services to contact other shopping centers, such as Fresh Pond Mall, Porter Square Shopping Center or Twin City Mall, to see if they can accomodate the residents of Manning Apartments and look into the availability of bus service for the purpose as an alternative to shopping at Purity Supreme when they feel as though they are not being treated fairly.
