WHEREAS: National Community Development Week will be celebrated throughout the nation from April 5th through April 11th, 1993; and

WHEREAS: A strong working relationship for providing community development services in Cambridge has been forged by its citizens, not-for-profit agencies, and city government; and

WHEREAS: The Housing and Community Development Act of 1992 has now provided additional funding for the Federal CDBG Program, from which Cambridge receives its principal support for community development work; and

WHEREAS: The new legislation will help the city and Cambridge not-for-profits provide a greater measure of affordable housing, human services, and economic development, as well as help Cambridge residents become more involved in the City's community development programming; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council hereby proclaim April 5-11, 1993 as Cambridge Community Development Week and do ask that we give special thanks and recognition to all citizens and organizations whose hard work has helped improve the quality of life in our neighborhood; and be it further

RESOLVED: That Cambridge citizens, and community development-related organizations are encouraged to thank our Senators and Representatives in Congress for continuing support of the CDBG Program, as well as to request our Congressional members' strong support for the doubling of next year's CDBG funding as tentatively proposed by the Clinton Administration.
