WHEREAS: Commonwealth Electric Light Company is the parent company of Cambridge Electric Company, which serves the homes and businesses of the City of Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: Commonwealth Electric entered into an electricity contract with Hydro-Quebec in 1986 for the purchase of electricity delivered to the company's parent (Canal Electric) as a member of New England Power Pool; and

WHEREAS: The Power provided under this contract is produced by the Hydro-Quebec project known as James Bay Phase I (the La Grande Complexe) located on the eastern shore of James Bay in northern Quebec province; and

WHEREAS: James Bay Phase I has caused enormous environmental damage, including but not limited to: the inundation of 4,400 square miles of forest, the alteration of an additional 68,000 sq. miles of watershed, the diversion and damming of five major rivers, the permanent alteration of migratory bird flyways, the permanent alteration of crucial caribou calving grounds, and the alteration of seasonal riverflow, ice-formation and breakup, and nutrient flow; and

WHEREAS: James Bay Phase I has caused the introduction of clear-cutting, mining, and other resource extraction, the release into the atmosphere of unquantified amounts of greenhouse gases such as methane, and the release of unquantified amounts of the toxin methyl mercury into the food chain; and

WHEREAS: James Bay Phase I has caused the disruption of the traditional way of life of the indigenous Cree peoples of the James Bay region who have inhabited Northern Quebec for five thousand years; and

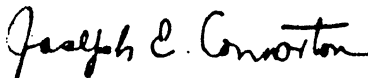
WHEREAS: Future contracts are in negotiation between Hydro-Quebec and New England's utilities, including Commonwealth Electric under the auspices of New England Power Pool, to supply electricity from additional hydro-electric projects proposed near James and Hudson Bays; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council opposes the signing of any future contracts by Commonwealth Electric for the purchase of electricity from Hydro-Quebec, expresses support for state and federal legislation that encourages the efficient and responsible use of electricity, and encourages Cambridge city officials to work with Commonwealth Electric and the Department of Public Utilities to implement more energy efficiency and conservation programs.

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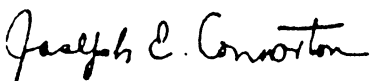
