WHEREAS: John Cusack has ably served the City of Cambridge as the Superintendent of the Water Department from 1981 to 1991; and

WHEREAS: He had served in the Cambridge Department of Public Works for two years prior to his appointment to the Cambridge Water Department; and

WHEREAS: In working with the Water Board, he and his staff have kept the system safely operating and have worked to maintain and improve the water quality; and

WHEREAS: Since 1986, he proposed and has overseen implementation of a five-year capital improvement program, the first since 1951, including such quality and safety measures as design and replacement of the raw water pumps and conversion from liquid chlorine to sodium hypochlorite disinfection to enhance public safety; and

WHEREAS: With his staff and the Cambridge Water Board, he has instituted aggressive watershed protection measures at Cambridge's water reservoirs in Weston, Waltham, Lincoln, and Belmont, a crucial step in light of many threats to our water supply there; and

WHEREAS: He has overseen construction of the two new clearwells at Payson Park, managing to reduce the construction time of three years to one and a half years, and the cost from 18 million dollars to 12.8 million; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council extends its greatest thanks to John Cusack, Jr. for his many years of public service and wishes him success in his new position with Bechtel/Parsons/Brinkerhoff; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to John Cusack, Jr.
