In Board of Aldermen, Feb 21st 1866

The committee on Roads and Bridges, to whom was referred, the petition of Jno. N. St Clair and others. "That a street may be laid out, from Main to State street", beg leave to report, that the prayer of the petitioners should be granted, at such time, as a plan of a street, forty feet wide, free of all incumbrances, shall be presented to the City.

Your committee would also advise, that, whenever the above conditions shall be complied with, the superintendent of streets, be instructed to build, and put the same, in suitable condition for public travel, at the expense of the City.

And the committee would further recommend, in view of the necessity that exists for a thoroughfare as

prayed for by the petitioners, not
only for the accommodation of
the large number of inhabitants
residing on, and south, of State
street, but also, for the public
generally, that an appropriation
of five hundred dollars (\$500.)
be made to aid in the pur-
chase of the land required,
