FAMILIES BURNED OUT ON DOUGLAS STREET

To date five (5) families displaced by the Douglas Street fire on May 31, 1987, have come to the Department of Human Service Programs for assistance. The Department's Emergency Community Case Worker and its Housing Search Program have been working with the families and the following is a status report on each:

FAMILY 1 - Mother, Father, and Six Children. Temporarily lodged with friends of the family. CHA has promised a permanent apartment to be available July 8.

FAMILY 2 - Mother, Father, and Four Children. Moved into permanent housing June 23.

FAMILY 3 - Mother and Four Children. Offered an apartment by CHA. Family viewing apartment today.

FAMILY 4 - Mother, Father, and Four Children. Currently living at a hotel in Brookline. The Department of Human Services Housing Search Program is currently aiding the family in looking for an apartment.

FAMILY 5 - Grandmother, Father, and Four Children. Currently living in a hotel in Malden. CHA has promised an apartment to be available June 29.

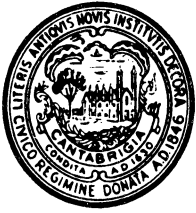
