

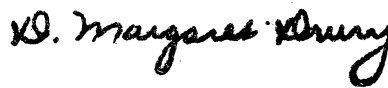

WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council has established that all city policies and their implementation must reflect and integrate these values: cultural and socioeconomic diversity, commercial diversity and vitality, a healthy environment, and the unique character of our city; and

WHEREAS: It is an expressed goal of this City Council to foster community by supporting opportunities for citizens to know each other within their neighborhoods and across the city; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge participates in the International Council for Local Environmental Initiative (ICLEI) and will soon launch the "Cambridge Climate Protection Plan," a guide for reducing greenhouse gas emission in the city by twenty percent; and

WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that the Cambridge Faith Communities will meet on October 9 to learn more about the climate protection plan and how they, as congregations, can participate in this citywide effort; and

WHEREAS: Massachusetts Interfaith Power and Light, a non-profit organization devoted to working with houses of worship and their congregations to reduce energy consumption, will assist in this meeting to inform the Cambridge faith communities about energy conservation; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record thanking Massachusetts Interfaith Power and Light, Cambridge Friends, and the Episcopal Divinity School for their efforts to organize the Cambridge Faith Communities around the goals of the Climate Protection Plan; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record commending those congregations attending the October 9 meeting for their willingness to learn more about energy conservation and its application in their places of worship and thanking them for their leadership on this issue; and be it further
