Gray C. Trembly of Arlington, 78, retired engineer

Gray C. Trembly of Arlington, a retired engineer, died Sunday at the Park Avenue Nursing & Rehabilitation Center in Arlington. He was 78.

Born in Terra Alta, W.Va., Mr. Trembly graduated from West Virginia University.

He worked in the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Radiation Laboratory with the group that developed LORAN.

Mr. Trembly was also employed for more than 25 years at Raytheon in its missile system division.

He was a life member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, member of the National Society of Professional Engineers and the Emeritus Club of West Virginia University.

Mr. Trembly was a member of the Cambridge Council of the Boy Scouts of America for more than 55 years and a scoutmaster of Troop 43.

Mr. Trembly is survived by his wife of 49 years, Emma Jane (West); a daughter, Anna Carter of Peterborough, N.H.; a son, Edward Dee of Arlington; a brother, Charles Dee of Terra Alta, W.Va.; and five grandchildren.

A funeral service will be held at 7 p.m. tomorrow at First Presbyterian Church, Cambridge.

Burial will be in Terra Alta Cemetery, Terra Alta.
