RE: Alcoholic Beverage Licenses

Gentlemen,

We would greatly appreciate consideration from the License Commission in establishing certain guidelines for the issuance of new pouring liquor licenses in the Central Square area. We feel that no more licenses should be issued than already exist for small restaurants, bars, clubs, or similar establishments.

I would also like to suggest the possibility of the License Board considering a second category or sub-division that would provide for pouring licenses for hotels and/or first class restaurants. This would permit sufficient latitude for the License Board to be in a position to issue additional licenses, but in a different category, if, in the opinion of the Board, that would be to the best interest of the City of Cambridge. This differentiation between types of licenses, or purposes, would be very meaningful and helpful.

At the present time, the area is saturated with small types of restaurants, bars, etc., as mentioned above. No further expansion in this category of business is desirable, in the opinion of our association.

We understand that there is a wide range of laws and ordinances, both state and city wide, which pertain to the governing of liquor establishments. We feel that your board should institute strong action against anyone who violates these laws. Liquor licenses of all kinds are issued subject to the recipient being fully aware of all obligations to uphold the law pertaining to a liquor license and said licensee would be made cognizant of the fact that the issuance of the license and its retention, was predicated upon the firm understanding that the laws would be obeyed.

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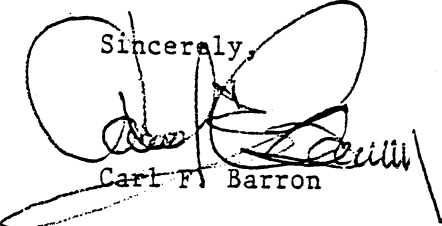
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We ask that you enforce all applicable laws in this regard.

Lastly, I feel that a legitimate business, considerate of its neighbors, and operating in a decent manner, should be permitted to continue to operate, without question. Conversely, those businesses which disregard the rights of others, including those who dwell in the vicinity and who have rights of their own which are not being considered, should be held to strict account, without sympathy, from the License Board.
