Cambridge City Council Meeting

Mayor Reeves, City Councillors:

I speak in regard to a curbcut application for 38-40 Banks Street.

We, the abutters, and Mr. Grant, the owner and applicant, have reached an agreement which we would like to formalize by bringing before you, the City Council.

The agreement is as follows:

- The curbcut will be 0'-1' from his property line, and extend 12'. This arrangement will take the fewest parking spaces from the public.
- Mr. Grant's driveway will allow parking for three vehicles, two of which will park in tandem, the third will be for the other dwelling unit in his house. This amounts to two legally recognized spaces.
- As a neighborly gesture, Mr. Grant will put his dumpster in his yard and will no longer use public parking spaces for his construction vehicles.

We withdraw our statement of July 31, 1995 which disapproved of the curbcut, and replace it with this three-part agreement.

We submit a sketch to the City Council with this statement. The sketch and the statement are signed by both myself and Mr. Grant to document our agreement.

The sketch shall be forwarded immediately by Mr. Grant to Zoning, Traffic & Parking, and Public Works as an ammendment to his application.
