This City Council learned with deep regret of the death of Right Reverend Thomas F. McNamara, a native of Cambridge and a graduate of Cambridge High and Latin School, in Puerto Rico on Saturday, March 1, 1969 at the age of sixty-eight, and

WHEREAS:-

Monsignor McNamara following his graduation from Boston College in 1920 entered St. John's Seminary and was ordained a priest in June, 1925 and served as a curate at St. Thomas Parish, Nahant and the Gate of Heaven Parish in South Boston prior to his assignment as Pastor of Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Belmont in 1960, and

WHEREAS:-

Monsignor McNamara had been honored many times for his efforts in rehabilitation of juvenile delinquents and founded the Catholic Boys Guidance Center and served as its director for fifteen years, during which time he rendered invaluable guidance to boys of all faiths, therefore be it

That this City Council go on record expressing their deepest sympathy on the untimely passing of this distinguished citizen and outstanding member of the clergy.
